

PG Application Process Flow

This flowchart has been designed to assist current undergraduate students who are looking to apply for Postgraduate study at the University of Greenwich.

Step 3 – Apply

Fill out the relevant online application for your chosen course, with the following information:

Fast Track

Banner ID, current course details and personal details.

Applying for a Master's Degree, Postgraduate Diploma (PGDip), Postgraduate Certificate (PGCert) OR any part-time PG

Create an OLAF login, fill out personal details, education and employment details, provide a reference (academic or professional) and write a personal statement.

PGCE Early Years, Primary, Secondary or Further Education and Skills PGCE (full-time)

Create a login, fill out personal details, education and employment details, provide a reference (academic or professional) and write a personal statement.

PGCE Early Years or PGCE Further Education (distance learning)

Create an OLAF login, fill out personal details, education and employment details, provide a reference (academic or professional) and write a personal statement.

MSc Nursing and MA Social Work

Create a new UCAS account, fill out personal details, education and employment details, provide a reference (academic or professional) and write a personal statement. Please note a charge of £22.50 applies for an application for one course or a charge of £27 applies for applications to two or more courses.

Step 4 – Await Decision

In most cases, you can expect a response within the following timeframes.

Fast Track

- 1 working day.

- Within 10 working days

Step 5 - If you receive a conditional offer, apply for the Greenwich Postgraduate Scholarship (GPS).

Deadline

Applications can be made until 30 June 2023.

What is the Greenwich Postgraduate Scholarship (GPS)?

A £5,000 waiver on tuition fees to complete a postgraduate course with us. The scholarships are available for all of our master's degrees, whether they be completed full-time or part-time.

GPS Eligibility criteria

- Must be a current final year undergraduate student at the University of Greenwich.
- Holding a conditional offer for a postgraduate course with the university.
- Must be predicted a 2:2 or above degree.
- Considered a UK national or an EU national resident in the UK paying home fees.
- Household income needs to be below £43,000 for this academic year.
- Not already studied a postgraduate degree
