Consideration will also be given to applicants who meet other underrepresented criteria in the following secondary categories:

3	Care experienced	A care experienced person is someone who has spent time in care during their childhood.
4	Estranged	An irreconcilably estranged person is someone who has not had any verbal or written contact with their parents for a significant period of time, and this is unlikely to change. This can include your biological or adoptive parents, or your only living parent. A significant period of time is usually considered to be twelve months or longer, but this can also depend on your circumstances.

Applicants must also:

- Have a UK nationality or residence status, and meet the nationality or residency status criteria to qualify for the postgraduate masters' loan
- Hold an offer to study for September 2024/25 on the Architecture Part 2 MArch course.
