A pan-London summary and four sub-regional reports commissioned by the four sub-regional partnerships.
Undertaken by the Institute of Employment Studies and WPI Economics

To:


- Develop an agreed definition of green jobs

Projections of green jobs in Local London

The total number of jobs in the central scenario is projected to rise from 32,000 in 2020 to 110,000 in 2050, representing an above-3-fold increase. Within this scenario, three sectors account for almost 8 in 10 (77.6%) of Local London's total number of green jobs by 2050:

- Power (41,800), representing 38% of total green jobs.
- Homes and Buildings (27,400), representing
 24.9% of total green jobs.
- Low Carbon Transport (16,100), representing 14.6% of total green jobs.





Local London Secured Strategic Projects

- Local London Green and Digital Mayoral Academy -£237k
 - A sub-regional project which will collaborate across 11 further education providers, 9 London boroughs and 30+ employers in the Local London region to ensure the GLA has a central delivery mechanism to improve is Green and Digital offer.
- Local London Green Academies Partnership £2.46m
 - A sub-regional project which aims to increase inward investment across the Local London region. Through an intensive capital and revenue investment model we will see 13 further education providers collaborate to improve the regions Green skills offer.

Total investment secured - £2.7m.


