Women Network Report 2019-20

Developing our Network Priorities

In 2019 the Women's Network held workshops at each campus where staff who identify as women shared their expectations of the network and identified priority areas to be worked on.

The workshops were held in July and welcomed women from Academic and Professional Services departments across the university, providing an opportunity to meet the committee and other women in the organisation. The conversation ranged from Book Club to Balanced Academic Workload and over 170 individual comments were received. The feedback has been reviewed and five main topics have been identified:

- Meetings
- Events
- HR Policies and Procedures
- Promotion
- Support.

The feedback on **Meetings** was immediately acted upon and is reflected in the group's Terms of Reference and meeting scheduling. The other four topics make up the Women's Network's priorities for the 2019-20 term.

The largest proportion of comments relate to HR activities, including feedback on the EDI Strategy which will be taken to the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Committee on 14 November 2019. A further workshop will be held to delve deeper into the comments relating to **HR Policies and Procedures**. The output from this workshop will be fed into the HR Policies team.

Lunch and Learn sessions and a Book Club were among the **Events** suggestions made by the groups, as well as guidelines for event panellists and moderators, to ensure that all groups are able to contribute to debates.

Suggestions for the **Promotion** of the network include using lanyards to celebrate International Women's Day and a <u>webpage</u> to promote the network internally. Promoting women role-models from across the university was also singled out as important to members.

Members of the network are keen to **Support** other women within the university. Mentoring, coaching, and promoting the existing support available at the university were all mentioned frequently. Supporting less experienced members of staff, as well as creating links with the <u>Students'</u> <u>Union FemSoc</u>, shows that the network's membership are keen to include and support women at all levels within the university.

Priority Updates

HR Policies and Procedures: Feedback on policies and procedures has been passed to HR and have been taken into consideration during a HR review. The Women's Network are represented on the EDI committee, who will be consulted on all future policy changes.

Support: Actions to set up a Mentoring System and Action Learning Sets were agreed at the WN meeting on 14th July. Suggest this action rolls over to 2020/21 priority list.
