I still remember trying to act straight and be "normal" when I was a young teenager, and it was absolutely exhausting.

What would you say to staff at the university who may be facing difficulties because of being LGBTQ+ or having difficulties "coming out" at work?

There are so many of us, come to an LGBT+ Staff Community meeting. If you are having difficulties in your team or from your manager, escalate to HR, and copy in the chairs of the LGBT+ Staff Community.

What would you like to see other colleagues doing to help make the university a better place to be LGBTQ+?

Don't treat LGBT+ colleagues differently, don't exclude or isolate them. Call out discrimination and microaggressions, even when it is someone more senior.
