	a) Overall Challenge There is a significant gap in understanding more-than-human marine, coastal, estuarine, and wetland relations in the UK and internationally. Significant sustainability and justice issues and challenges are unfolding in ocean, marine and coastal places and efforts to explore governance and societal change is needed, including questioning of hegemonic ways of knowing and valuing. Through critical, feminist, biopolitical, more-than-human and decolonial and interdisciplinary approaches (drawing from diverse disciplines such as human geography, anthropology, sociology, sustainability sciences, environmental humanities and arts) there is the opportunity to identify new ways in which people and natures can flourish in such dynamic, salty spaces, including through civil and multi-actor engagement, ethnography, and arts-based methods etc.
