- 2.1 Minutes of the last PGR ECR Forum meeting held on Thursday 11 November 2021 were approved
- 2.2 Actions Update was given.

2.3 Research and Knowledge Exchange Committee update

- 2.3.1 R&KE sub-strategy has been presented to the Academic Council and successfully received.
- 2.3.2 Thank you to the working groups involving PGRs who helped inform and develop the sub-strategy
- 2.3.3 Last REF results will be released on 9 May 2022. Sector wide results and comparisons will be available 10 May 2022 and will be publically available on 12 May 2022 and the University of Greenwich will then know what grants are awarded.
- 2.3.4 The Great Cycle, will start looking at future REF targets. If PGRs, ECRs are interested in applying for grants or submitting for the next REF to raise with GRE team.
- 2.3.5 50% increase in PGR is a target in the sub-strategy and will be backed by funding.

- 3.1 PULSE SkillsForge Management System update
 - 3.1.1 Testing is currently being done of the overview of the platforms for supervisors and PGRs
 - 3.1.2 Testing is also underway for training booking and management side.
 - 3.1.3 The system will be released in stages and with key dates in mind. Overall end date has moved from August to December 2022.

RF/RETI/21-22/F2/4. **Discussion Matters**

- 4.1 ECR Networks across University
 - 4.1.1 The main functions of the Networks would be on funding opportunities, networking across disciplines
 - 4.1.2 FEHHS have a website for the ECR Networks, where ECRs work on events, meetings and collaborations, mentorships schemes of new ECRs by experienced ECR.
 - 4.1.3 FBUS ACTION to write to faculty and discuss the setup of an ECR Network.
 - 4.1.4 FLAS has a ECR Network.

4.2 PGR Wellbeing Support

- 4.2.1 PGR student experience working group looks at the whole PGR transition from graduate level throughout their journey undertaking their research study. GSU is also on the working group and are also looking at wellbeing support. The group is also exploring the entry points for PGRs. Looking at gaps across campuses for a standardised student experience. PGR student journey mapping exercise is currently being undertaken. It is important for PGRs to provide feedback on this work so that PGRs can inform their needs so that solutions and improvements can be made to meet the needs. PGRs Members are encouraged to get involved.
- 4.3 PGR student wellbeing survey, FEHHS
 - 4.3.1 All PGRs, EdD students and members are encouraged to complete the survey.

4.4 3MT update

- 4.4.1 Currently faculty heats are taking place and members are encouraged to promote the competition amongst PGRs. The final is taking place on 17 May 2022.
- 4.4.2 The rules are set by University of Queensland and only allow PhD students (not MPhil) to participate in the final competition. However, those not transferred can take part in the faculty heats.
- 4.5 Postgraduate Research Experience Survey (PRES) 2021 university-level findings; PRES Action Plan consultation
 - 4.5.1 FLAS survey highlighted the research culture is poor. It was suggested this may be correct for some departments as the group is very diverse group and also as Covid has left people on their own. However, the result is surprising as FLAS has good collaborations across some departments, and there are networks, spaces etc. available. It was also suggested that the response rate may have not been good and therefore representative of only a small group.
 - 4.5.2 It was raised if there has been any discussions on restructuring as FLAS has also gone through a restructure and may not be well represented for PRES.
 - 4.5.3 PGR Wellbeing, Library resources were considering areas for improvement.
 - 4.5.4 *ACTION*: Members are requested to go through the document and provide any feedback to put into the Action Plan, which will be presented to the Academic Council in April 2022.
- 4.6 Faculty PGR/ECR and Students Union members update and feedback (All)
 - 4.6.1 No further updates from faculties or GSU
 - 4.6.2 FES NRI, there will be a new PGR representative for the next meeting.
 - 4.6.3 FLAS: glad to see faculties being more streamlined
