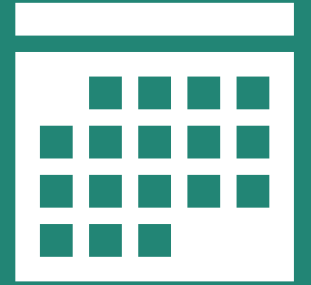

Overview of Staff Essentials

What are staff essentials?

- They are for **all staff on the research pathway**.
- They are **linked to your appraisal** as development goals.

Why are they essential?

- These sessions prepare you for supervision practice in general, and at Greenwich in particular.
 - How do I approach key elements of the supervisory relationship?
 - What do I need to know to recruit new postgraduate researchers?
 - What are the visa compliance regulations and what do I have to do if I am supervising an international PGR?
 - Understanding Research Ethics at Greenwich
 - How do I approach examining or chairing a PhD examination?

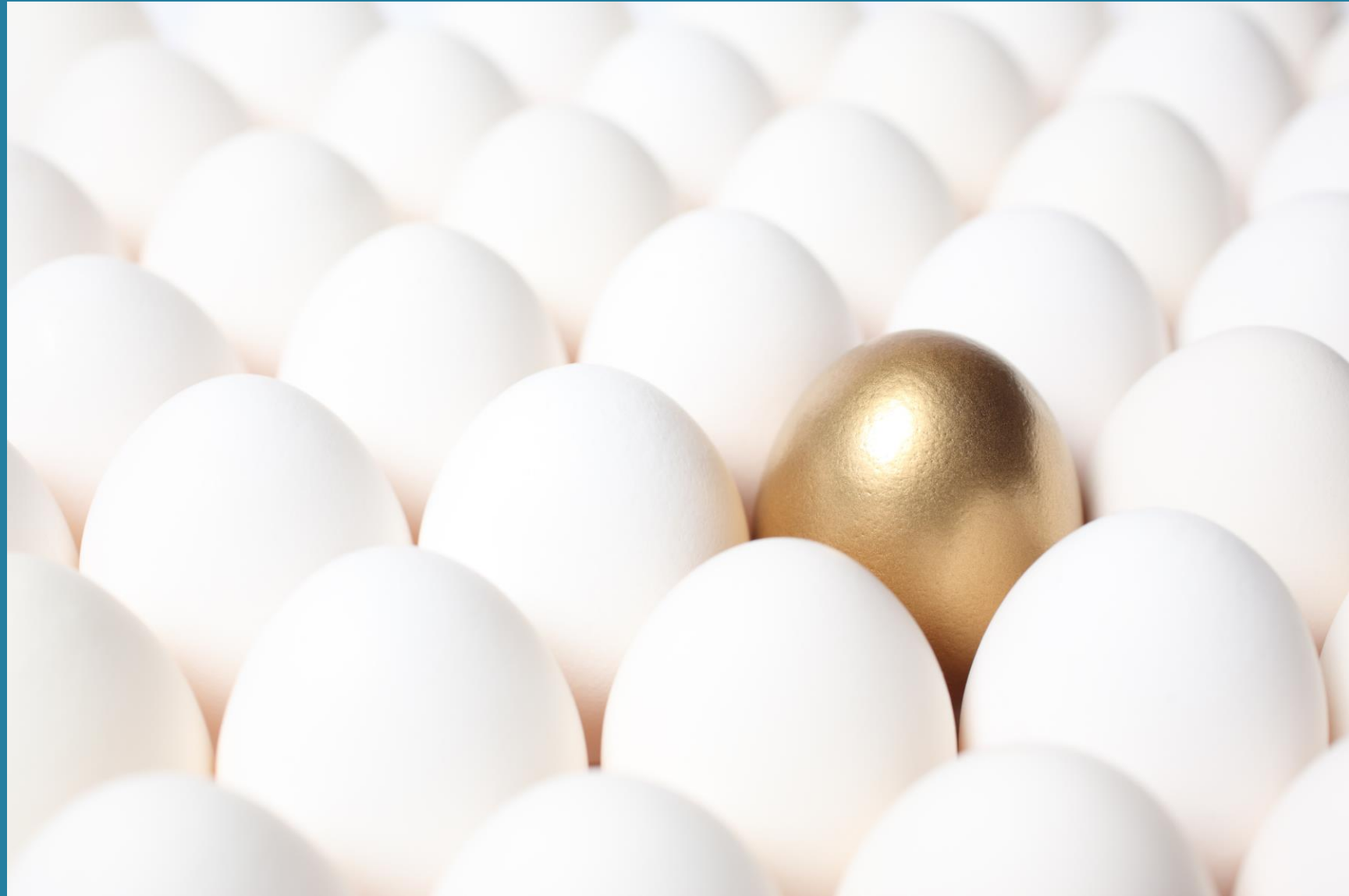

Session	Description

Share your experiences and listen to the experiences of colleagues.
<u>Greenwich Inclusion Plans for PGRs</u> 21 October, 1pm to 2pm	Drop in discussion with subject matter experts, Shapna Compton and Kate Southgate, plus input from supervisors who have worked with GIPs for PGRs. What are the challenges of ensuring that reasonable adjustments for PGRs are appropriate, what do we do if they change, how do we apply some of those adjustments and who can we go to for help. Really valuable session to spread the PGR GIP word and give all our PGRs what they need to progress and succeed.

Section 6: PULSE

What is PULSE?

- PULSE is the digital environment used by Greenwich to support PGRs, supervisory teams and researcher development activities.
- It is an online system designed to give you all the information you need in one place, enabling streamlining of administrative processes, giving you greater access to key progression and training information, and providing a simple booking platform for researcher development opportunities.

What does PULSE do?

PULSE enables PGRs to:

- Access information relating to their record with the university
- View their key academic milestones
- Record supervisory meetings and points of contact
- Complete and submit forms designed to enable progression (formerly Research Degree Administration forms)
- Complete a Development Needs Analysis (DNA) linked to the Vitae Researcher Development Framework (RDF)
- View and book Researcher Development activities and events
- View and maintain a record of their training and development activities

PULSE enables supervisors / research staff to:

- Submit supervisory teams for approval
- View your supervisee's programme information
- View your supervisee's meeting records
- Sign Induction Checklists for your supervisees
- Complete and submit Research Plan Approval forms for your supervisees
- View your supervisee's timeline of mandatory training
- View and book your own Researcher Development training and development activities
- View a record of your own training and development activities

- **PGRs:** PGRs should record ALL courses and activities not organised via PULSE on their Training and Development Portfolio in PULSE. They can do this via the Completed Activities section under the Professional Development tab and select self-record an activity.
- **Staff:** Your main record sits in Horizon. All your development activities should be entered on Horizon record. If you wish your PULSE activities to show in Horizon please manually enter them onto your training record. PULSE will integrate with Horizon in the future but does not do so at present.
