1. The university's **January Big Welcome will start on 5th January 2026**. Big Welcome is a set of in person and online activities that the university prepares for incoming students to support your transition. Expect to see more emails about these events in your inbox as we get closer to January.

2. MSc Programme In-Person "Big Welcome Day"

The **MSc Global Public Health Programme Big Welcome Day (induction day) will take place on Monday, 12th January 2026, from 13:00pm to 15:30, beginning in King William Room KW002, on the Greenwich Maritime Campus. Attendance is required for MSc students, please plan to arrive a little early so that we are able to start on time.**

This day will include a series of sessions designed to introduce you to the programme and provide key information and resources to support your studies.
