Project Title:	Healing Spaces: How trauma-informed design can inform social justice					
Project Description:	Healing Spaces: How trauma-informed design can inform social justice  This project is an investigation into the potentiality of trauma-informed (TI) design in therapeutic, educational, and justice settings to enhance wellbeing and justice outcomes.  Tl approaches have been adopted in fields as varied as social services, prisons, youth justice, housing, healthcare, and education. They are increasingly recognised as best practice in addressing social and community problems. The space in which clients access services is an important component of TI practice, however, there is no existing cross-disciplinary research that examines how TI space is conceptualised and materialised in social, justice, and healthcare settings. This project will address this gap in the TI practice research.  Aims:  Recognising that space, place and personhood are co-constituted, this project aims to:  1. identify how we create spaces which enable (vulnerable) people and societies, to heal.  2. bring diverse disciplines (criminology, geography, and design) together to produce an interdisciplinary, intersectional understanding of the connections between trauma, space, and social justice  3. explain how TI approaches are affected by spatial organisation and produce empirical evidence on best practice related to spatial considerations for TI projects, thereby developing a theory of trauma-informed design  We are seeking creative and enthusiastic applicants from a range of backgrounds who hold a first or strong upper second-class honours undergraduate and Masters degree.
